### 3. PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

It is important that you park within your allocated area within the paddock as indicated on the attached plan. Failure to do so may result in you being asked to leave the venue.

Paddock access will be from 09:00 on Tuesday and the paddock should be vacated by 12:00 on Monday.

### 4. PASSES:

Passes will be sent to you through the post where they are required; those under the age of 16 are admitted free of charge. Please note there are no vehicle passes for marshals at this meeting.

The Drive Centre is found by turning left by the main gate and driving around the perimeter road to the Hangar bridge, going over the bridge and the drive centre is on the right. Park on the gravel area indicated.

There is a recovery briefing at 07:00 on Friday which should be attended before signing-on.

There are Pit-Lane marshals' briefings at 07:45 on Friday and at 08:30 on Sunday; marshals should sign-on before attending the briefing. Both briefings will take place in the Wing Auditorium.

## 6. RACE SELECTION PROCEDURE:

In National events grids will be formed for the fastest:  
50 Sports & Sports Racing Cars over 2000cc  
54 Sports & Sports Racing Cars up to 2000cc  
58 In other categories

## 7. SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:

All vehicles will be examined at the times indicated on the published timetable.

## 8. NOTICE BOARD:

The official noticeboard is located at the foot of the Race Control building.



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## **9. BRIEFINGS:**

Briefing times will be published in the final timetable.

## **10. NOISE POLLUTION:**

Engines should not be run before 08:30 or after 18:30 on any day

## **11. CIRCUIT ACCESS & EGRESS:**

WEC Competitors are based in the “Wing” garages with all sessions operated from there.

ELMS and FIA F3 are based in the Heritage Pits and Paddock and will operate from there for all sessions. At the appropriate times cars will be released from the pit lane to the track, at the end of all sessions the chequered flag will be shown at the Wing finish line and cars will then slow, returning to the Heritage pit lane accessed just after turn 7 on the right and proceed to Parc Fermé

At the start of their race ELMS Competitors will leave the pit lane and then form on the Heritage Grid where the countdown will be given. At the green flag signal the cars will complete one and a half laps before taking the start at the Wing Start Line.

At the start of the FIA F3 races cars will be released from the pit lane to drive and form up at the Wing Grid following which the countdown will be given in accordance with championship regulations.

## **12: RESULTS:**

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions.

## **13. JUDGES OF FACT:**

Judges of Fact may be appointed in accordance with the International Sporting Code

## **14. CIRCUIT & MEETING NOTES:**

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track. Competitors who experience mechanical problems, particularly if that problem is likely to be a hazard to others, must be stopped immediately in a place of safety. The competitor may also be liable for any excessive clean-up costs involved.

Motorsport is a non-contact sport and competitors who make contact with each-other render themselves liable to penalties in accordance with the code. Likewise competitors should remain within the limits of the track and failure to do so will render the competitor liable to penalties.

The circuit fuel station will be open during the meeting.

All working areas should be kept clean and tidy and any waste placed in the appropriate container. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. In the event that the BARC is charged for such issues then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified.

Any person who is injured or feels unwell should seek help from the circuit medical services. During the hours when the track is open please contact an official or member of the venue management team.



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## **15. MARSHALS MATTERS:**

Marshals camping will be at Winterhills which is located behind the outside of Copse corner. Access will be via the main gate then turn left and drive round towards Copse past the new college building then through Gate 5 into the field. Camping is free for marshals, showers and toilets will be provided. There is limited power hook up available on a first come first served basis.

Post allocations will be advised at sign-on but please remember you should not use mobile phones or cameras while on duty. If you are unable to attend please contact Paula Brown and return your passes to the BARC.

## **16. SOCIAL MEDIA**

Both officials and competitors alike are reminded that they should not make comments upon social media sites which may in any way be deemed as being derogatory, defamatory, obscene or libellous. You should remember that comments made are in a very public arena and can be seen by possibly more than your intended audience.

## **17. SAFEGUARDING:**

A number of officials within the club are appointed as safeguarding officers and they are available to deal with problems which may arise or are brought to their attention.
