Any protest or appeal needs to be lodged with the Secretary of the Meeting in the administration office or the Clerk of the Course. Judicial hearings will be conducted in the usual way but those attending should bring face masks/covering to any discussion or interview. Once a decision has been made it will be announced verbally and passed by email to those concerned but there will be no need for a signature to acknowledge receipt of any document. 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4. PADDOCK ACCESS & ALLOCATION:

It is vitally important that you park within your allocated area within the paddock as indicated on the attached plan (see section 28). Any competitor/team that parks in an area that is not assigned for them in the paddock and refuses to move when asked by an official will be reported to the Clerk of the Course. Paddock Access

Only vehicles with paddock access passes will have access to the paddock. It is important that you park within your allocated area within the paddock as indicated on the attached plan. Failure to do so may result in you being asked to leave the venue. Access to the paddock will be available at the times below. Please respect the times and directions of the officials - the controls are there to aid the successful running of the event.

Access to the paddock on Friday evening will be from approximately 20:00 when the track day customers depart. The paddock must be vacated by 21:00 on Sunday.

On Saturday evening the CNC Heads competitors will need to wait on the grass area outside the paddock entrance while the C1 competitors depart.

5. PASSES:

Passes will be sent to you prior to the meeting but those under the age of 13 are admitted free of charge. Please note there are vehicle passes for access to the paddock for this meeting.

6. SIGNING-ON:

- Details of Competitor sign-on are included in the BARC Covid-19 Competitor Guidance (2021 v3). Competitors a) will not sign-on at the meeting having previously completed signing on electronically using the BARC Rev-Up system. Upgrade cards will not be filled in at the event but rather anyone needing to upgrade must provide Motorsport UK with appropriate documentation to prove their finishing positions.
- b) Details of Officials sign-on are included in the BARC Covid-19 Officials Guidance (2021 v2). Officials will not sign-on at the meeting having previously completed signing on electronically using the BARC Rev-Up system. However, all marshals must see the chief marshal between the times below to confirm their attendance, receive their post allocation.
- c) Marshal's entry into the circuit for sign-on will be by the Paddock entrance: you will go through security at this point and turn right into the Melbourne Loop. Your ticket will need to be shown on entering into the circuit at all times so please make them available.

8. SCRUTINEERING & ELIGIBILITY:

Each competitor must complete the self-declaration form as part of the sign-on process. A selection of cars will undergo pre-event scrutineering and random checks will be undertaken on approximately 50% of vehicles at the scrutineer's discretion. Eligibility may be checked by the appointed Eligibility Scrutineer or by any member of the Motorsport UK Technical Commission as listed within the Motorsport UK Yearbook.

<u>11. NOISE POLLUTION / CHECKS:</u>

Engines must not be run before 09:00 or after 20:00 on either day. Noise checks will be made in the Assembly Area except for C1 & CNC Heads which will be checked in the pit lane prior to their qualifying sessions. The C1s and CNC Heads cars should move to the font of their garage approx. 30min prior to the start of their session to allow the checks to be made swiftly.

12. CIRCUIT ACCESS & EGRESS:

All Except C1 & CNC Heads

Cars will assemble on the Melbourne Loop: they will access the area via the gate opposite the Formula E building.

For practice you will be signalled to proceed onto the circuit at the start of your practice session.

For races you please see the Start Procedure details below. For further details please see the Driver Briefing Notes.

C1 & CNC Heads

For Qualifying cars will depart of the Pit Lane. For races you please see the Start Procedure details below. For further details please see the Driver Briefing Notes.

At the end of all practice qualifying and races vehicles will take the flag complete a slowing down lap and enter the pit lane making their way to the Parc Fermé area.

13. RACE START PROCEDURE:

The following Championships/classes will have a Rolling Start:

British Truck Racing Championship Legends Cars National Championship with MRF Tyres Pickup Truck Racing Championship Silverlake C1 Racing Series

The following Championships/classes will have a Standing Start:

Caterham Graduates Racing Club Championship CNC Heads Sports/Saloon Championship

Please read the Driver Briefing notes for full details.

BTRC / Pickups & C1 will assemble on the Melbourne Loop; they will form up on the grid and then undertake their green flag lap prior to a rolling start.

Legends will undertake their green flag lap from the assembly area (Melbourne Loop) without stopping on the grid. They will undertake a full lap of the circuit prior to a rolling start.

CGRC & CNC will assemble on the Melbourne Loop; they will form up on the grid and then undertake their green flag lap. They will form up on the grid again and then start.

14. LIVE SNATCH:

There is "live snatch" permitted at this event.

15. RED FLAGS:

Any category which generates a "red flag" may be placed at the end of the schedule subject to time being available.

16. RESULTS:

All time sheets, grids and results are deemed to be provisional until the conclusion of all judicial actions. Results will be available on the TSL website: <u>https://www.tsl-timing.com/event/213322</u>







17. PRESENTATIONS:

The first three finishers in a race without classes or in a multi-class race the winner and subsequent class winners should proceed to the podium as quickly as practical where awards will be given and interviews held.

18. JUDGES OF FACT:

Judges of Fact may be appointed in accordance with G10 and Q3.1 of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook.

19. RACE-DAY INFORMATION:

The organisers will try to run the programme as published however reserve the right to bring forward, delay or abandon event sessions to suit the conditions.

20. VIDEO EQUIPMENT:

Video equipment may be fitted to the car if it is not used for commercial purposes. All equipment must be fitted to the vehicle at scrutineering and failure to do so may mean that the camera will be removed.

21. CIRCUIT & MEETING NOTES:

BARC will not be liable for any damage caused to vehicles being recovered from the track.

Competitors, who experience mechanical problems, particularly if that problem is likely to be a hazard to others, must be stopped immediately in a place of safety. The competitor may also be liable for any excessive clean-up costs involved.

There are signal lights around the circuit and these lights have the same meaning as the flag signals.

Garage doors are to remain open at all times to allow suitable airflow times, **except during BTRC sessions**, where the Pit Lane side garage door must be closed for safety. The rear door must remain open at all times. It is also essential that cable covers are used for any wires that are stretched across the fire lane at the back of the pit garages. Competitors must also ensure that the fire lane is kept clear at all times as this lane is required for emergency access.

Motorsport is a non-contact sport and competitors who make contact with each-other render themselves liable to penalties in accordance with the current Motorsport UK Yearbook. Likewise, competitors should remain within the white lines defining the edges of the circuit. Failure to do so will render the competitor liable to penalties up to and including exclusion.

The circuit fuel station will be open during the meeting.

Any person who is injured or feels significantly unwell should seek help from the circuit medical services. At the current time everyone should use their best judgement to decide if an injury can be dealt with without a visit to the medical centre.

General Health & Safety

Championship Co-ordinators and representatives are asked to visually check garages and working spaces for the following:

- 1) Fuel is stored in suitable containers with lids away from sources if ignition;
- 2) Each competition car has one suitable fire extinguisher stored in a usable location (i.e., not in race transporter) and is both tested and in-date;
- 3) Floor/ground is kept clean & tidy;
- 4) Waste is disposed of in identified bins & containers provided by circuit. Waste must not be mixed or waste left around the site. In the event that the BARC is charged for such issues then the charge will be passed on to the championship concerned if the individual cannot be identified;
- 5) Old tyres must be taken away by teams/competitors unless championship has arrangements with tyre company (there will be waste disposal charge levied to the championship for any items which are controlled/hazardous that BARC and or Circuit have to dispose of);
- 6) No trailing electrical cables that can cause electric shock or tripping hazard;
- 7) Waste/grey water from motorhomes must be disposed of in line with circuit requirements;
- 8) Work at height without harnesses and fall restraints is not permitted.

Spectators and Children

MSV have indicated that spectators and rules for child tickets will return to those pre-2020. Children 13 and under are free while 14-15 years and seniors have a discounted rate. See the MSV website for further info.

Garage 39 restaurant will be open from 07:30 until an hour after the final chequered flag serving hot food all day.

Live Music - Saturday Evening

22. MARSHALS MATTERS:

Please see section 6 for Sign-on. Post allocations will be advised at sign-on. The Post-Chiefs briefing will be issued by email in advance of the meeting.







Camping If you have not previously informed us or ES team that you are camping you will not have a space allocated, if you wish to camp you MUST inform either Paula Brown or Mel Baggley in advance of the meeting. Space is extremely limited for camping, any problems on arrival please call Mel Baggley on 07795 275 211.

The campsite will be in designated area within paddock 3, and you may gain access from Friday evening but the area must be vacated at the end of the meeting. Toilets will be located next to the showers block, which is behind the Launch Pad building in paddock 3.

After driving though sign on, enter the circuit from the Melbourne Loop, gain access to the outfield at the gate beyond Post 9 (Old Hairpin) just after the bridge on your left, for infield posts, at the top of the loop, hop across to Post 23, where you will access the infield perimeter roads.

Donington are organising a stage for live music in the paddock next to Garage 39 on the Saturday evening.

23. TRUCK SESSION REQUIREMENTS

All marshal posts must fully evacuate into a public area; no marshals are to remain track side of public fencing while the circuit is live for Trucks.

The Pit Lane should be evacuated of all personnel, with the exception of a minimum number of truck mechanics, doors to the garages must be closed. Marshals are to stand next to the pit garages, unless instructed by the Clerk of the Course via Race Control to display a flag at Startline.

In the event of an incident, Marshals should await the instructions of Race Control or the arrival of the Course Car on scene.

At the end of the Truck session, after the last vehicle has past your location, marshals should return to post promptly to enable the next session to start.

Post Chiefs should take their radio's off post and Flag Marshals should take Yellow and Red Flags.


