FLAG SIGNALS

BLUE - STEADY:

Another competitor is close.

BLUE - WAVED:

Another competitor is trying to pass.

WHITE:

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW - WAVED:

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

DOUBLE YELLOW - WAVED:

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking.

YELLOW WITH RED STRIPES:

Slippery surface ahead.

RED:

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline and marshals posts).

GREEN - WAVED:

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

BLACK WITH ORANGE DISC DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER:

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE WITH WHITE NUMBER:

Warning to driver that his behaviour (ie. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

BLACK DISPLAYED WITH WHITE NUMBER:

Driver must call in immediately to the pits and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK/WHITE CHEQUERED:

End of race

Races are started using a system of red/green traffic lights.

SPECTATOR NOTICES

Please do not leave litter about the grounds - take it with you.

Remember to drive with care and caution when leaving the grounds. To safeguard both competitors and public animals are not admitted. This is most important.

Prohibited Area Notices

The public are not permitted in the areas where these notices are displayed. The fences are there for protection, and any person or persons found trespassing or wilfully damaging trees, fences, etc, will be prosecuted by Motorsport Vision Limited. 1. VEHICLES + SCOOTERS, BUGGIES & QUADS

- The use of paddock bikes, scooters, quads and buggies etc...
 must be covered by 3rd party insurance when driven on site
- · No mini bikes permitted (eg. dirt bikes, trial bikes or pit bikes etc...)
- Maximum speed of 10mph around site
- No electric stand-on scooters







2. SAFE SCOOTER, BUGGY & QUAD USE

- No children/babies as scooter passengers
- Only drive if you hold a valid license
- No leaving keys in ignition
- · No carrying of unsecured loads
- No mobile phones / eating / drinking whilst driving



3. WORKING AT HEIGHT

Never stand on a roof without protection from falling e.g.

- Put up secure side barriers
- Use a clipped on safety harness
- Use a secured step/ladder (not a domestic ladder)
- Ensure your step ladder is not damaged
- do not use if faulty





4. SPECTATING

- Not from tail lifts/truck roofs/trailer roofs
- · Not from venue infrustructure e.g. waste bins, fencing or generators



5. PADDOCK ACCESS

NO PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE PADDOCKS







No skateboarding No bicycles No ball games



6. HOT WORKS AND FUEL

- No hot works including welding on site
- Keep fuel storage to a minimum and in a safe location
- · Keep fuel away from ignition sources.
- No smoking near refuelling areas
- Keep a fire extinguisher close by
- Refuel when engine is turned off and cooled





Risk of fire or explosion No hot work permitted

7. CABLES AND TAIL-LIFTS

- · Cover cables with matting or tape down flat
- · Tail lifts should not be left unattended at the half-way point

TODAYS RACING

The BARC North Western Centre is particularly pleased to be returning to our home circuit to get another season underway after the disruption of last year. The winter has been spent well by most of the people involved in racing to prepare cars and to train up in all the organisational activities. Now we return to the circuits to make it all pay off.

Several of the BARC's championships start their new season here today and take to the track several times for races during the course of their full day. All the cars racing are a wide variety of either sports or saloons and they are backed up by the incredible superkarts.

A new series on show today is BARC Red, which is designed to get more cars on to the track in a simple and spectacular format. This series caters for a wide variety of cars which are classed by lap times. Just about anything can run but their class will change if they exceed their declared lap time.



Caterhams are well known to everyone of course and have several races today for the Sigmamax, Sigma 150 and Sigma 135 varieties. A formula for close and exciting racing.



Superkarts are back! With Division 1, F125 Open and F450 National. Everyone enjoys the spectacle of karts at a fast circuit and the incredible speeds which often match and exceed the fastest cars.

The big news today is that the CNC Heads Sports Saloon Championship returns here for its 38th season! Additionally 2021 is the 14th season that our sports saloon championship has been sponsored by one of Ric Wood's companies, CNC Heads. This is an engine preparation company based in Manchester. Ric is no mean racing driver himself and a superb example of loyal support which is massively appreciated by the NW Centre officials and drivers. He often puts in an appearance in the championship every now and then in one of his phenomenally quick cars.

Driver registrations have flooded in from the start of the year with several new drivers and cars this season. In spite of all the issues from the Covid-19 pandemic numbers are equal to the last few seasons. We look forward to new faces and cars making their mark in the racing against the returning regulars.


Just to remind you, the championship contains two major categories with classes A, B and C being Specials where just about any amount of modification of the cars is allowed. The body shape does not mean that the engine came from that model of car or even that it is in the same place as the original. Classes D, E and F are Modified where the cars must retain the original production body shell and engine type.

The classes are divided by engine size with A and D above 2500cc, B and E 1600cc to 2500cc and C and F up to 1600cc.

At the time of writing we have a full grid of CNC Heads competitors with the entry spread across all the classes. It seems this year we have a resurgence of interest in Class A, home of potentially the most spectacular cars. Unfortunately Simon Allaway has had to withdraw but there are three Sakers driven by Paul Rose, Steve Harris and Dave Clark. They will have fierce competition Paul Woolfitt in his Lotus Exige.

Other 'specials' drivers to look out for include Paul Dobson in his fire spitting Locost 7 and Jon Woolfitt's Spire in Class B as well as the ever fast and spectacular Danny Bird in his Class C Spire. The Modified class entries are very similar to last year, so all the popular drivers are back out again. Garry Wardle and Oliver Thomas in their Class D Porsche and Subaru respectively always mix it with the specials and will give them a run for their money again. Watch also for sponsor Ric Wood in his Nissan Skyline, 'the fastest saloon car round Goodwood'. 2020 Champion Jamie Cryer is out to defend his title in his beautifully prepared Ginetta G20. Class E also sees Chris Maries competing with his grandson Jake Johnson! Graeme Smith is back out in his Class F Mazda MX5.

Description:

The Superkart Championship is run in four classes, Division 1, F450 National, F250 National and F125 Open. The championship is run mostly on long circuits similar to Oulton Park rather than specific kart tracks and the Superkarts are just as quick as the cars they share the meeting with.

May 8th/9th - Snetterton
August 21st/22nd - Silverstone
October 23rd/24th - Donington

Provisional Points:

This is the first round of the championship so no points to date.

SUPERKART CHAT by Gary James, Freelance Superkart Reporter & Commentator

BSRC SUPER SERIES - FIRST ROUND

The Superkarts are back in action at Oulton Park this weekend, six months after they closed out their 2020 season at the same circuit. This meeting sees the opening rounds of the British Superkart Racing Club's Super Series, a re-badged championship which will see future rounds at Snetterton, Silverstone and Donington Park.

All four of the Superkart classes will be competing on track at the same time which slightly limits the entry level, but a format has been worked out which should provide some great racing. The lap records for the four classes are shared by two drivers and for the first time ever they will be competing against each other in the Division 1 category.



Reigning BSRC club champion Liam Morley holds two of those records (Division 1 and F125 Open) and is hoping to get a good start to the season. He certainly won't want a repeat of last October where a win was bookended by two retirements. Not the usual form we have come to expect. Liam was unable to sell the championship winning chassis over the winter to make way for new kit, so will be using the same Anderson VM set up that took him to six wins and two lap records. His only concern is that he will be recovering from leg surgery and hopes it won't hinder his performance.

So, who could capitalise in the twin cylinder Division 1 Superkart class if Morley is not at 100%?

Local driver Carl Hulme finished level on points with Morley last year but after dropped scores had to settle for second spot in the club series. Consistency was the key, so we should see Carl battling up at the front again. Tom Rushforth, the zero-plate holder, took

advantage of Morley's misfortune last October to take a win and secured third place in the final points standings. He should also feature strongly today.

Land speed record holder and former European Superkart Champion Lee Harpham collected a win and a second at Oulton last year, but a long brake pedal in the final race of the season saw him bounce off Rushforth and then throw it away at Lodge Corner. That denied him the chance of securing second place in the club championship and left him in fourth spot. Lee will be out to avenge that mistake and take the fight to Morley, his former sparring partner in the F125 Open class.

Three other drivers that will be out to make an early impression are Sam Moss, Andy Gulliford and Matt Robinson. Moss returned to the F250 National class last year and picked up five wins after competing in the F125 Open class for the previous five seasons.

During that time, he had numerous battles with Morley and Harpham. He impressed a lot of people with a brief outing in a Division

1 Superkart at Silverstone a couple of years ago, and it will be interesting to see how he gets on with a full time move into the class. Gulliford is the other driver that holds two lap records at Oulton, in the F450 and F250 classes. He collected two wins in F250 last October and just missed out on the BSRC club championship by 2 points. Can he transfer his previous success in the F250 and F450 classes into the Division 1 category? Robinson is the former English Champion in the F125 Open category and also finished runner-up in the F125 Open British Championship in 2019. During that year he had his first taste of twin cylinder power at Assen where he managed an 11th place finish. He has bought the ex-Andy Bird MSUK British Championship winning kit and will be another driver to watch out for at the front.



Five-time MSA British Superkart Champion Paul Platt heads the F250 National class after a lean season in 2020. One outing at Cadwell Park in July was his only appearance and that resulted in three retirements. However, valuable data was obtained and Paul is confident that the 'non-visible' changes he has made to the PVP Gas Gas set-up will put him back on the top step of the podium. Lee Plain will be hoping to keep Platt from securing victory. He wrapped up the BSRC F250 Championship last year with nine second place finishes and would love to get a win under his belt. Two weeks ago at Darley Moor he tied on points for the English Championship but lost the tie-break by 0.21s. Can his luck change? Curtis Seymour is another driver to look out for. Success came at Darley Moor last year to back up his 4th place finish in the 2019 British Championship.

The F250 National class sees two young drivers making the step up from the F125 Open category. Luke Clemson took a year out in 2020 after finishing third in the MSUK F125 Open British Championship, while Rob Stubbs makes a return to Superkarts after a 6-year break.



Hoping to make an impression amongst the men are the three lady drivers, Sam Hempshall, Catherine Foster and Ami Jerger. Sam secured fourth place in the 2020 club series and also picked up a couple of class wins at the Gamma Race Weekend at Assen.

In the F450 four stroke class, Nick Flint collected five wins in 2020 to wrap up the BSRC club series from John Busby. They will have strong opposition for success from Kevin Ridley and Nick Kirk.

With several drivers switching classes, the F125 Open category is not at the levels it once enjoyed. Clint Bridge and Michael Parr will resume their battles from last year and should be disputing the top spot with Fletcher Hurn and Jack Tritton hoping to pick up a good result.

The action at Oulton will be fast and furious with 40 Superkarts on the grid. All eyes will be on Deer Leap to see who emerges victorious.

Division 1 Superkarts

Yellow Plates / Black Number

These are twin cylinder 250cc two stroke engines with a six speed gearbox. These awesome machines pump out around 100bhp and can reach speeds in excess of 140mph given the right circuit configuration. Usually in - line twins from a variety of manufacturers from around the world including the FPE from France, the Danish PVP, the Czech Republic VM and the Italian DEA. Very much a pan European formula and popular around the world.

Minimum Weight - 218 kgs including Driver

Formula 250 National

White Plates / Black Numbers

Has one of the biggest followings. Restricted to 250cc single cylinder two stroke power units with a maximum of five gears, engines are water cooled and produce around 65 to 70 BHP.

The Italian DEA engine along with the Spanish Gas Gas engine are the front runners in this class. The THR and Viper are British built engines.

The once dominant Honda engine is still popular though not a front runner any more but a good clubman engine

Minimum Weight - 208 kgs including driver

Formula 450 National

Red Plates / White Numbers

Relatively new to the world of Superkarting and is the first 4 Stroke class.

With Moto X now very much 4 Stroke orientated it was only a matter of time before we saw these engines being brought into use. A variety of 450cc engines from the Moto X world are available such as KTM, TM, Husqvarna, Rotax, Yamaha, and Honda. Now forging their own future as a separate class running alongside the 2 strokes

Minimum Weight - 218 kgs including Driver

Formula 125 Open - Blue Plates / White Numbers Sadly it has declined in the last couple of years and is now the smallest class on Long Circuit.

Proper reliable race engines built for the sport.

A great handling kart. Good second hand kit available, The engines used are purpose made water cooled, single cylinder two stroke units with reed valve induction producing about 45 to 48bhp with TM, DEA, IAME and Vortex being popular makes. Most of the karts run with Long Circuit bodywork.

Great for new comers to the sport but by no means slow with lap times not far behind the 250 single cylinder class. Minimum Weight - 195 kgs including Driver

Identification of the Karts - Superkarting has its own unique system for numbering employing different colour Number plates for each class. The top ten finishers in the previous year's championships carry numbers 1 to 10. There are also special plates which signify victory in other special events.


