

WHAT WE ARE DOING TO KEEP VISITORS AND OUR COLLEAGUES SAFE



A robust plan has been completed including a COVID-19 risk assessment and additional measures have been put in place to ensure the safety of our guests and colleagues while at Thruxton.

KEY INFORMATION

- We have carried out a COVID-19 risk assessment
- We have additional cleaning, handwashing, hand sanitising and hygiene procedures in place
- We have taken all reasonable steps to ensure government guidance on social distancing is maintained

We will be taking extensive measures to ensure the health and wellbeing of our guests and colleagues throughout the venue by implementing strict social distancing and other preventative measures in our facilities to ensure we can operate safely. This will include clear signage and enhanced cleaning procedures.

In addition to this, we have sourced and invested in hand sanitiser stations, anti-viral surface cleaning products and protective safety screens where appropriate.

We do however rely heavily on the cooperation of our visitors to comply with the latest government guidance and best practice to ensure a safe venue for all. In line with Government guidance, if you are displaying any symptoms whatsoever (new/persistent/continuous cough, fever and loss or change to your sense of smell/taste) you should not attend Thruxton under any circumstances.

2021 RACE MEETINGS

Thruxton will host a bumper year of motorsport action in 2021 including two visits from the British Touring Car Championship in May and August. The British Superbike Championship returns in June with the Thruxton Historic just a week later. British Truck Racing will rumble into Thruxton in July. We also have race meetings from the Classic Sports Car Club and BRSCC later in the year.

SUMMARY

Attending an Event

This summary explains the new procedures and safety measures we have put in place to protect our guests and colleagues and ensure Thruxton is COVID-secure.

BEFORE ARRIVAL

- Ticket holders are advised to check our website and social media pages for the latest information before leaving home
- Visitors must not attend if they are displaying any symptoms associated with COVID-19 or are required to self-isolate

ON ARRIVAL

- Additional signage is in place to reinforce social distancing measures, highlight one-way systems and hand sanitiser locations
- Hand sanitiser will be available at all building entrances and exits and key areas for all visitors to use
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) will be available for all members of staff

MAINTAINING SOCIAL DISTANCING AND VISITOR SAFETY

- Thruxton has large areas of open spectator banking, allowing guests to easily space themselves out and adhere to social distancing guidelines
- There is prominent social distancing signage around the venue
- Walkways and building entrances and exits may be one-way or closed where social distancing is not possible
- Some facilities may not be open at every race meeting

RESTAURANTS AND FOOD

Thruxton Centre

- Food and drink will predominantly be served in disposable containers with plenty of bins available
- Signage will reinforce social distancing within queues
- New hygiene screens have been installed at service counters
- Cutlery and condiments will be given to visitors with their meal on request, rather than left in open areas
- Payments will need to be 'contactless' (where possible)
- All members of catering staff will be wearing appropriate PPE

Food Outlets

- Concessions will be open around the spectator banks

TOILETS

- Enhanced cleaning procedures and disinfecting of high-frequency touchpoints such as doors, taps and flush handles
- Hand sanitising stations are available in the key entrance and exit points
- Signage and floor markers will be in place to enable social distancing in queues
- All visitors are asked to uphold the highest possible hygiene standards which are supported by signage in key areas
